A Level English Literature for first teaching in 2008





QCA have stipulated that:

- The number of units required to achieve GCE A Level is to be reduced from 6 to 4
- Specifications should encourage students to develop their interest in and enjoyment of literature and literary studies as they:
- · Read widely and independently both set texts and others that they have selected for themselves
- Engage creatively with a substantial body of texts and ways of responding to them
- Develop and effectively apply knowledge of literary analysis and evaluation in speech and writing
- Explore the contexts of the texts they are reading and others' interpretation of them
- Deepen their understanding of the changing traditions of literature in English
- Specifications should require candidates to use detailed knowledge and understanding of individual works to explore relationships between texts and appreciate the significance of cultural and contextual influences
- · Specifications should require candidates to show knowledge and understanding of a range of literary texts including at least 2 examples of each of the genres of poetry, prose and drama
- A minimum of 6 texts should be covered at AS and a minimum of 6 texts at A2. Texts should be chosen so that they illuminate one another
- Learners should experience a range of reading to include:
 - At least one play by Shakespeare
 - Work by at least one author writing between 1300 and 1800
 - At least one work first published or performed after 1990
 - At AS, work by at least one author published between 1800 and 1945
- AS specifications should require students to show knowledge and understanding of:
 - The functions and effects of structure, form and language in texts
 - Some of the ways in which individual texts are interpreted by different readers
 - Some of the ways in which individual texts relate to one another and to the contexts in which they are written and read
- A2 specifications should require students to show knowledge and understanding of the significance of:
 - The ways in which writers use and adapt language, form and structure in texts
 - The interpretation of texts by different readers, over time
 - How texts relate to literary traditions, movements and genres
 - Cultural and contextual influences on readers and writers
- Internal Assessment must be included and weighting can be up to 40%
- Stretch and Challenge style questions to be introduced into A2 assessment

AS	Literature post -1900	F662 Mandatory 40% AS 20% A Level Coursework	In this unit learners have the opportunity to study their own choice of texts right up to the present day, thus they have the freedom to follow areas of individual interest and enjoyment. As part of their coursework folder candidates can choose to complete a close critical analysis of a section of their chosen text and to develop further their literacy skills. Freedom of choice of passage enables candidates to pursue their own study of a text with which they connect. Alternatively, candidates can undertake their own re-creative writing based on their chosen text, thus candidates gifted with a talent for writing can explore composition in relation to an author of their choice. Candidates are also given the opportunity to explore texts informed by other readers' interpretations, which opens up perceptions on the role of author and reader.	OCR is currently developing teacher support, programmes of INSET and working closely with publishers to deliver support to accompany the new specification.
