1 Radio 2, the BBC's popular music and entertainment station for 25 – 45 year old listeners, is presenting a short programme about the significance of tattooing. The programme explores the developments in tattooing from earliest times to the present day.

You have been asked to write the script for this pre-recorded programme using the material provided.

You are not expected to suggest any of the music to be included in the programme.

Write about 1000 words.

Your text should be accompanied by a commentary in which you explain some of the significant decisions and choices you have made in writing it. The commentary should be approximately 150 - 200 words.

2 A broadsheet Sunday newspaper includes a Style and Fashion section each week entitled *Chic*. This is aimed at readers aged 18 - 30.

A forthcoming issue will contain an illustrated article entitled 'Tattooing – Then and Now'. The article will examine the history of tattooing and its modern fashionable development.

You have been asked to write the text for this article using the material provided.

Write about 1000 words.

Give a brief indication of the layout of the article and indicate any illustrative material that you wish to be used.

Your text should be accompanied by a commentary in which you explain some of the significant decisions and choices you have made in writing it. The commentary should be approximately 150 - 200 words.

3 Saga Tours, a company specialising in holidays for the over 50s, offers themed weekends. There will be one on King Arthur based at a hotel in the West of England. Guests will visit some of the major sites associated with Arthur including Tintagel, Cadbury and Glastonbury.

To accompany the tour, each holiday maker will receive an information pack.

Use the material provided to write the section of the pack that gives background information about King Arthur and how he has been portrayed by different authors.

Write about 1000 words.

Your text should be accompanied by a commentary in which you explain some of the significant decisions and choices you have made in writing it. The commentary should be approximately 150 - 200 words.

4 Radio 3, the BBC station that specialises in classical music and the arts, is to broadcast the first performance of the new opera 'Arthur and Guinevere'.

During the interval, there will be a scripted talk entitled 'King Arthur: Man or Myth?' This talk will explore the evidence as to whether Arthur was a real historical figure or merely a legendary hero.

Use the material provided to write the script for this talk.

Write about 1000 words.

Your text should be accompanied by a commentary in which you explain some of the significant decisions and choices you have made in writing it. The commentary should be approximately 150 - 200 words.
