3 Read the passage below and answer the question that follows.

It is essential that corporal punishment be re-introduced in schools, young offenders' institutions and prisons in order to reduce criminal violence. The rise in the murder rate in the United Kingdom since capital punishment was abolished proves that we should also consider restoring the death penalty. Validating this suggestion is the fact that no fewer than 80,000 people signed an e-petition demanding this within twelve hours of the petition being posted on the website.

4 Read the following source and answer the question that follows.

Some years ago Aaron Barschak, a comedian, interrupted a talk given by British avant-garde artists Jake and Dinos Chapman at the Modern Art Gallery in Oxford. The Chapman brothers were discussing their work, *The Rape of Creativity*. This work features a series of cartoon heads superimposed on a series of etchings by the Renaissance master Goya.

Barschak splashed red paint on the walls of the gallery, on one of the etchings and on Jake Chapman, shouting as he did so, *Viva Goya!* Charged with criminal damage at Oxford Magistrates' Court, Barschak claimed that what he did had been an art work, created out of the Chapman brothers' work just as they had created a work out of Goya's.

Sentencing Barschak, District Judge Brian Loosley said, "This is a serious offence of wanton destruction.....even by modern standards and by stretching the imagination to incredulity, your action was not the creation of a work of art."

Using **only** the information presented in the source, **briefly** evaluate the actions and opinions of Aaron Barschak.

In the light of your own experience and that of your family, evaluate the truth of this statement. Your answer should refer to change in any **two** of the following domains: social, cultural, scientific/technological. **[50]**

- 7 “To plan for a year, you need to plant rice; to plan for a decade, you need to plant a tree: and to plan for a lifetime, you need to educate a girl.”

Evaluate this statement with reference to the needs of less economically developed societies. **[50]**
