The task

You are working as a management trainee with a company which owns and manages several care homes for elderly people in urban areas of the UK.

Your manager knows that you studied Advanced Level Geography. She has asked you to use the knowledge, understanding and skills which you developed on your course to suggest how the labour market in the care sector might develop over the next 25 years.

- 1 Suggest how the following might change over the next 25 years:
 - demand for places in UK care homes for the elderly
 - the supply of, and demand for, labour to work in those homes. (10 marks)
- 2 (i) Identify the factors which are leading to people wishing to migrate from the applicant countries to the countries in the present day European Union.
 - (ii) Discuss how and why the scale and pattern of migration might change if the applicant countries are successful in their bid to join the European Union. (15 marks)
- Your manager is planning to attend a meeting of representatives from companies in the UK care home business. They are going to discuss the impact of possible enlargement of the EU on the supply of, and demand for, labour in that business.
 - (a) In order to meet the needs of the business should she: oppose the expansion of the EU;
 - **or** support the expansion of the EU?

Justify your decision.

(b) Suggest any further developments in UK or EU policy that might be necessary to meet your manager's needs for labour. (10 marks)
