- 1 Answer the following with reference to the tropical regions of Africa with wet and dry seasons.
 - (a) Describe the seasonal variations in wind direction, precipitation and temperature in these regions. (7 marks)
 - (b) With the aid of a diagram, explain the 'soil moisture budget' of these regions. (6 marks)
 - (c) Outline the hydrological responses to the seasonal variations in climate described in (a). (5 marks)
 - (d) Show how the vegetation of these regions is adapted to the seasonal variations in climate. (7 marks)
- 2 (a) Describe the major forms of international migration that have taken place in the last 30 years. (7 marks)
 - (b) Identify two pieces of evidence that suggest there are two main attitudes to international migration, those in favour and those against. Explain how each piece of evidence demonstrates one of these attitudes.

 (6 marks)
 - (c) With reference to one example, outline what is meant by a multicultural society. (5 marks)
 - (d) Discuss the issues that have arisen from the development of multicultural societies. (7 marks)

3 "The major physical characteristics of the surface of the Earth are the consequence of the global pattern of tectonic processes."

Discuss this statement.

In your answer, you should:

- describe the major physical characteristics of the Earth's surface;
- outline the global pattern of tectonic processes;
- evaluate the strength of the relationship between the major physical characteristics and tectonic processes. (25 marks)
- 4 "Vegetation changes over time in the British Isles are more the result of natural processes of succession than of human activities leading to plagioclimaxes."

 Discuss this statement.

In your answer, you should:

- describe a vegetation succession that has taken place in the British Isles, such as a lithosere;
- outline the human activities that have resulted in plagioclimaxes within the British Isles;
- evaluate the relative importance of natural processes and human activities in vegetation changes over time.
