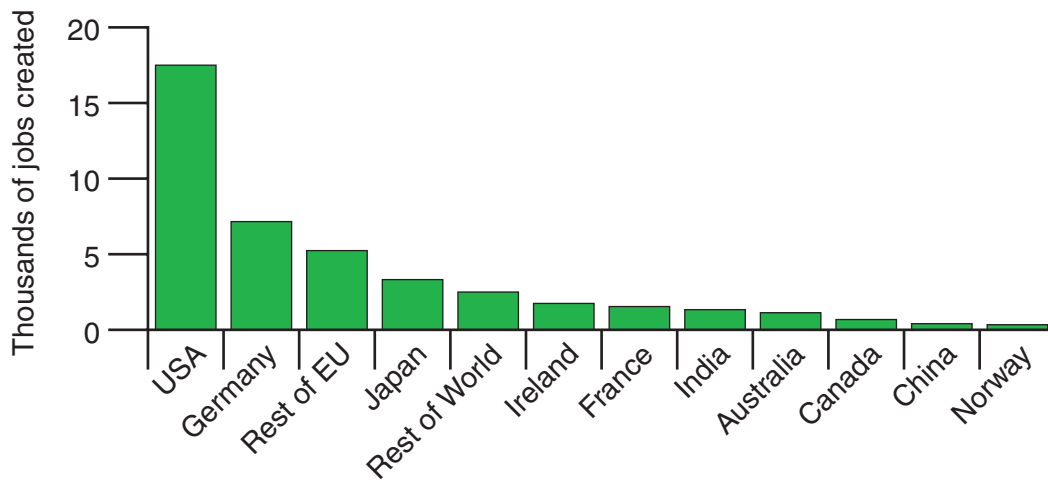

Number of jobs created through foreign investment 2005



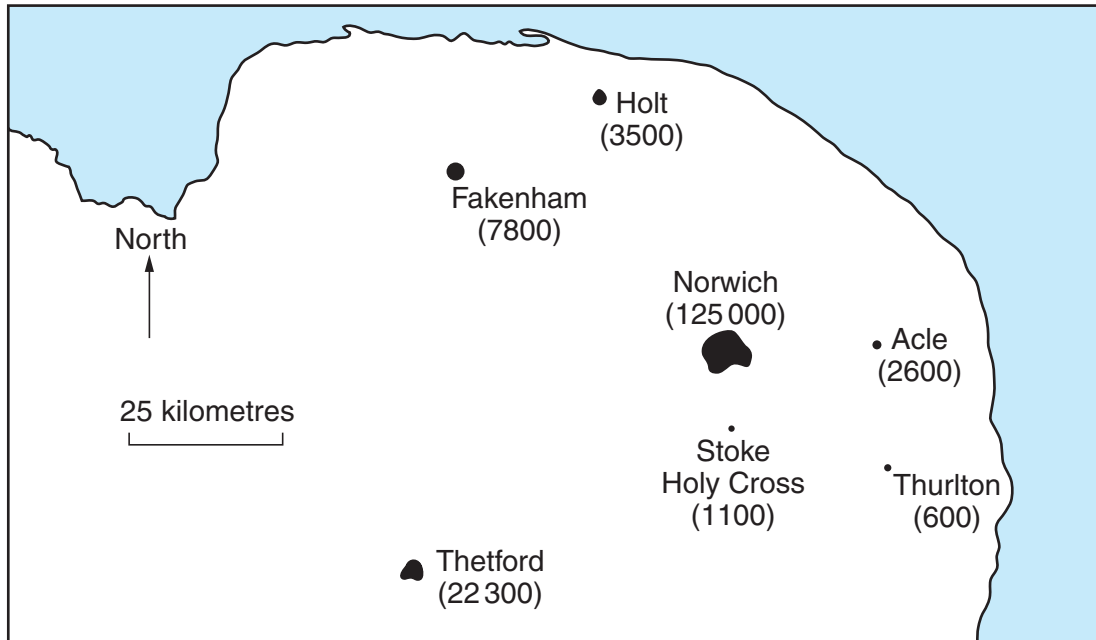
Major foreign investors in UK 2005

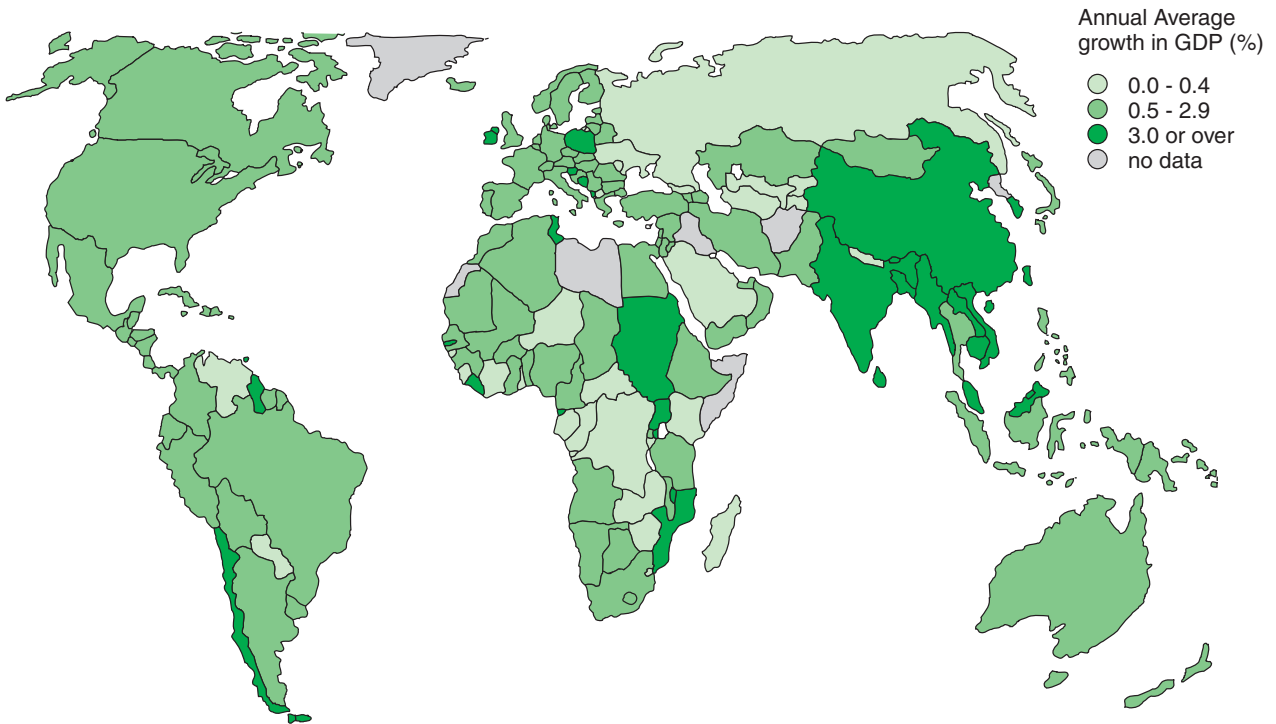

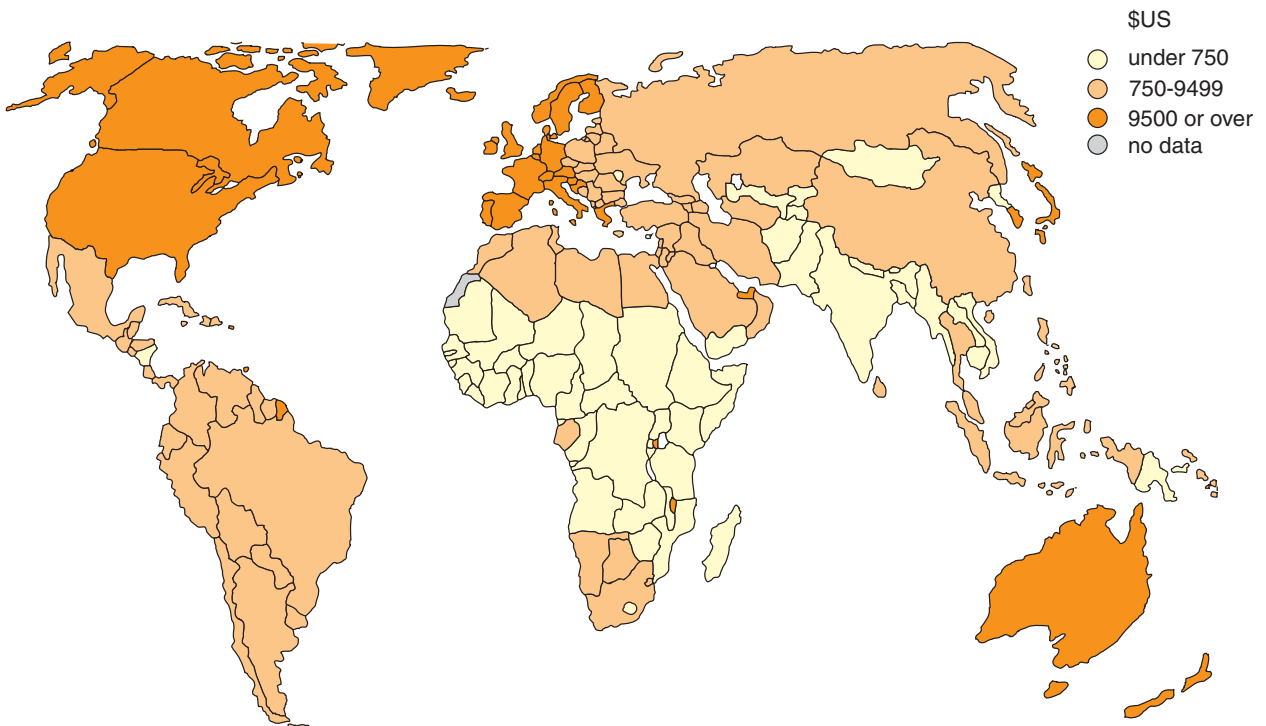
