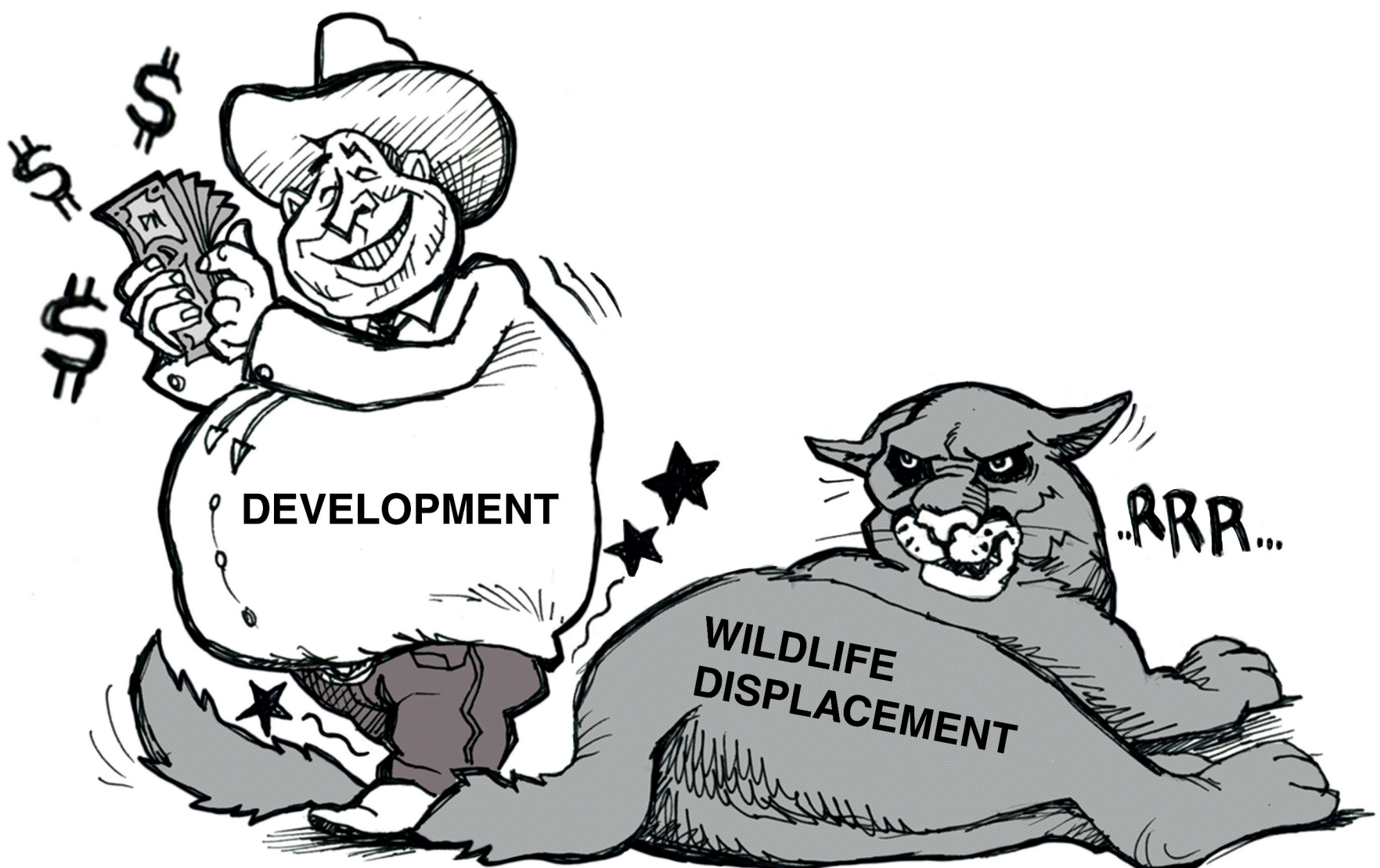
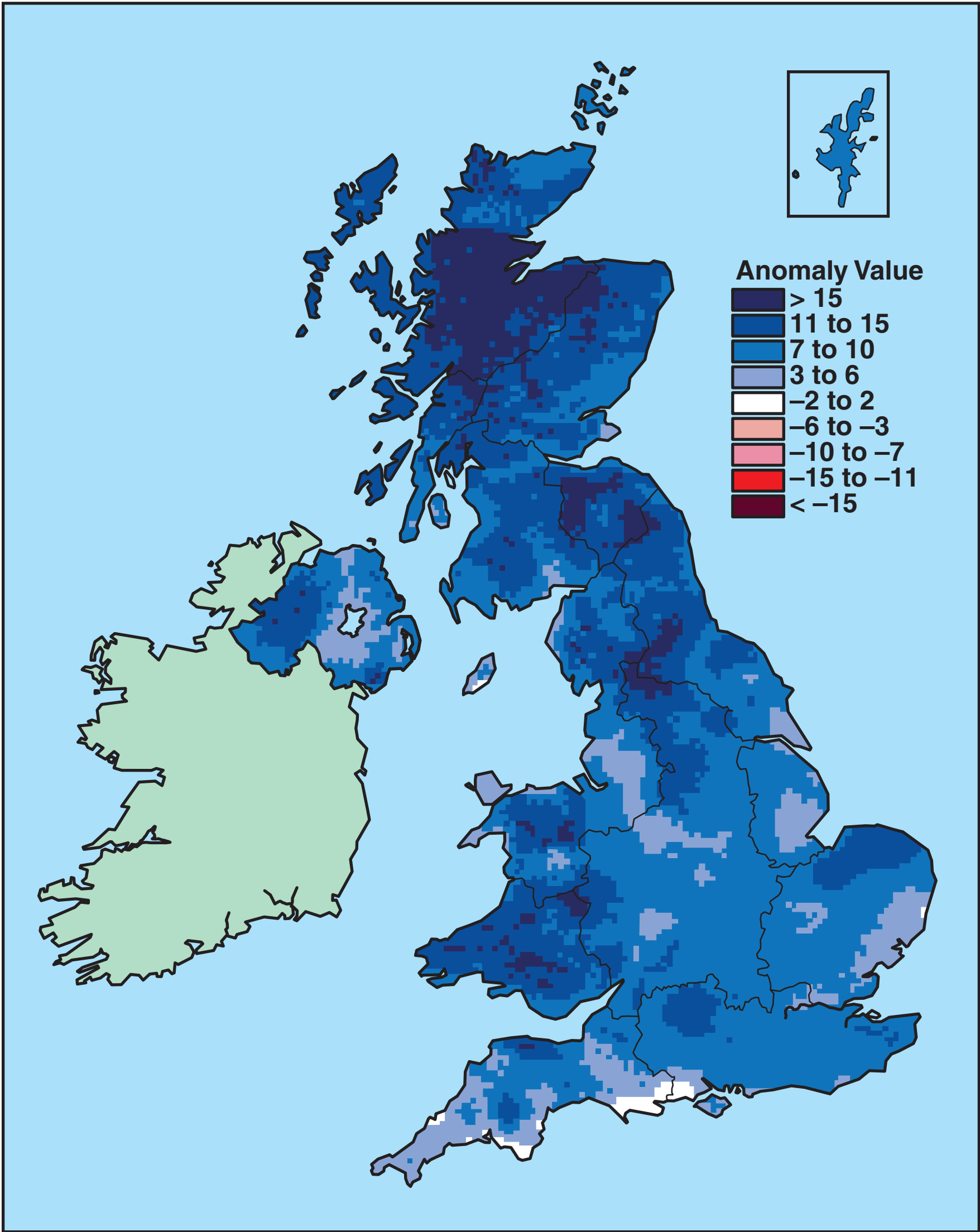

Number of days in January 2010 with snow lying, compared to the average for that month

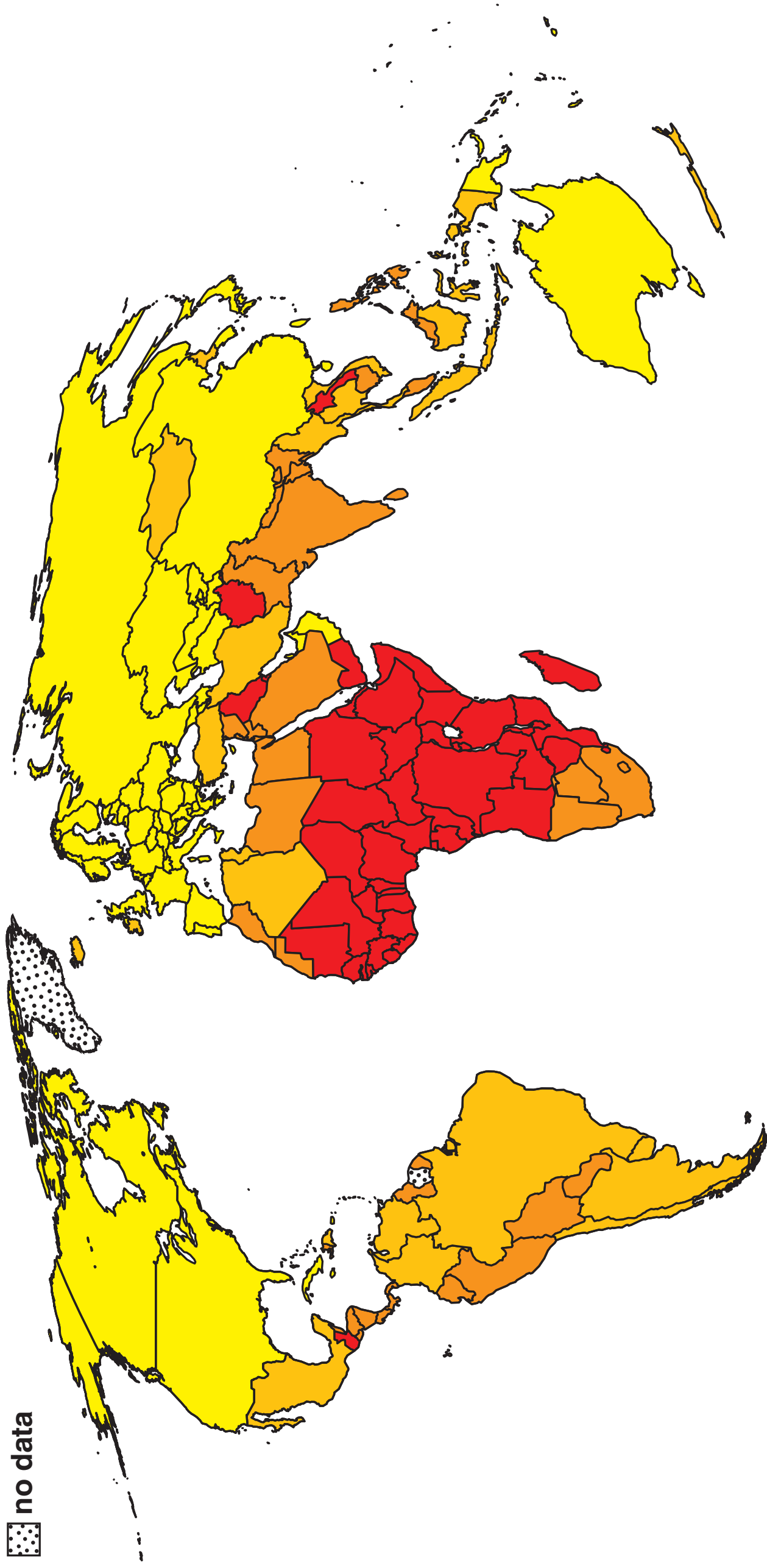
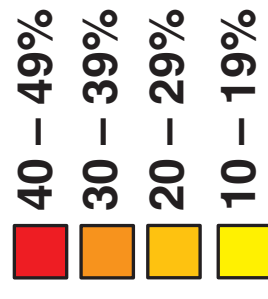
Key: Anomaly value indicates the number of days snow was lying, compared to the long term average for January.

Global pattern of population under age 15 years, 2012



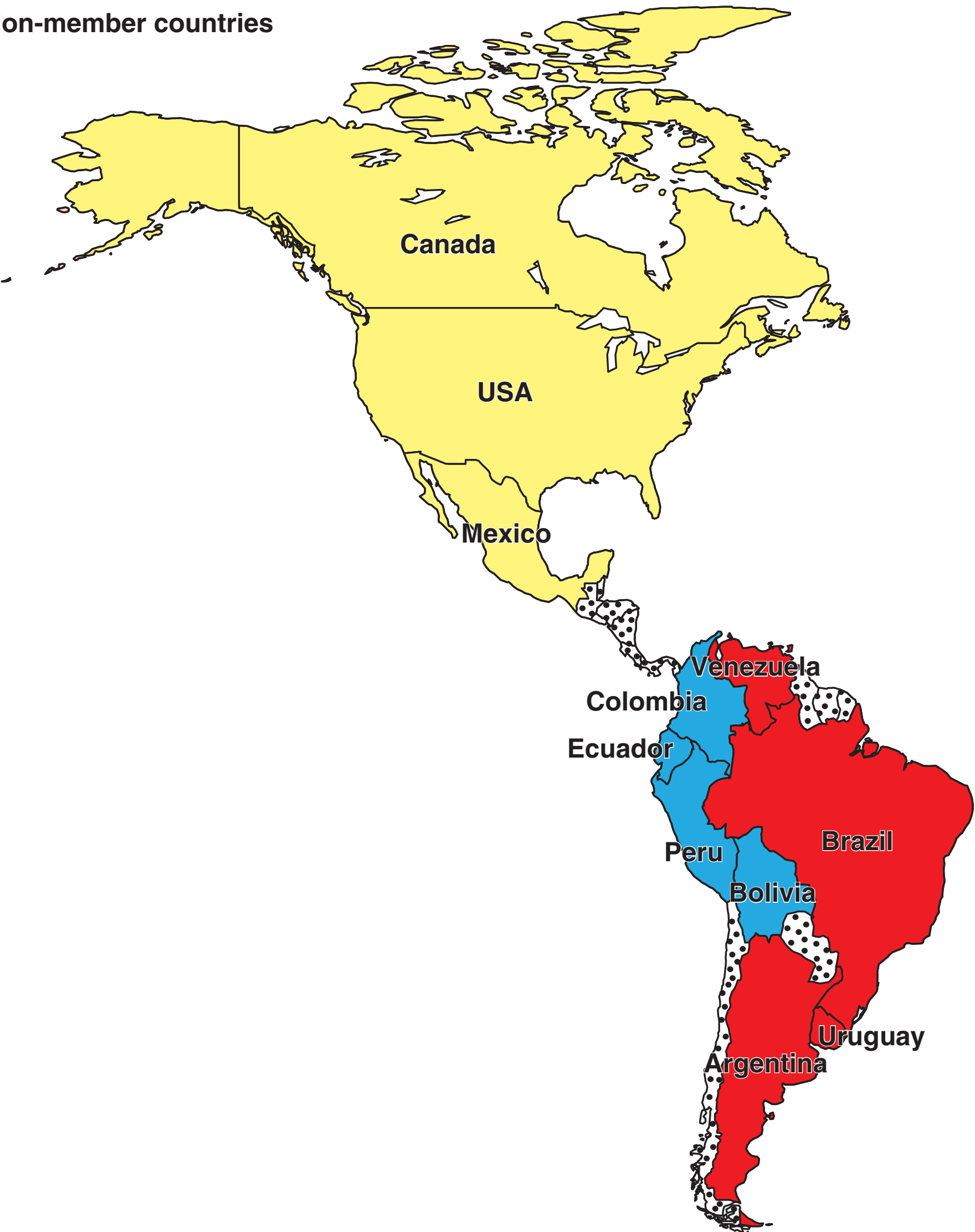

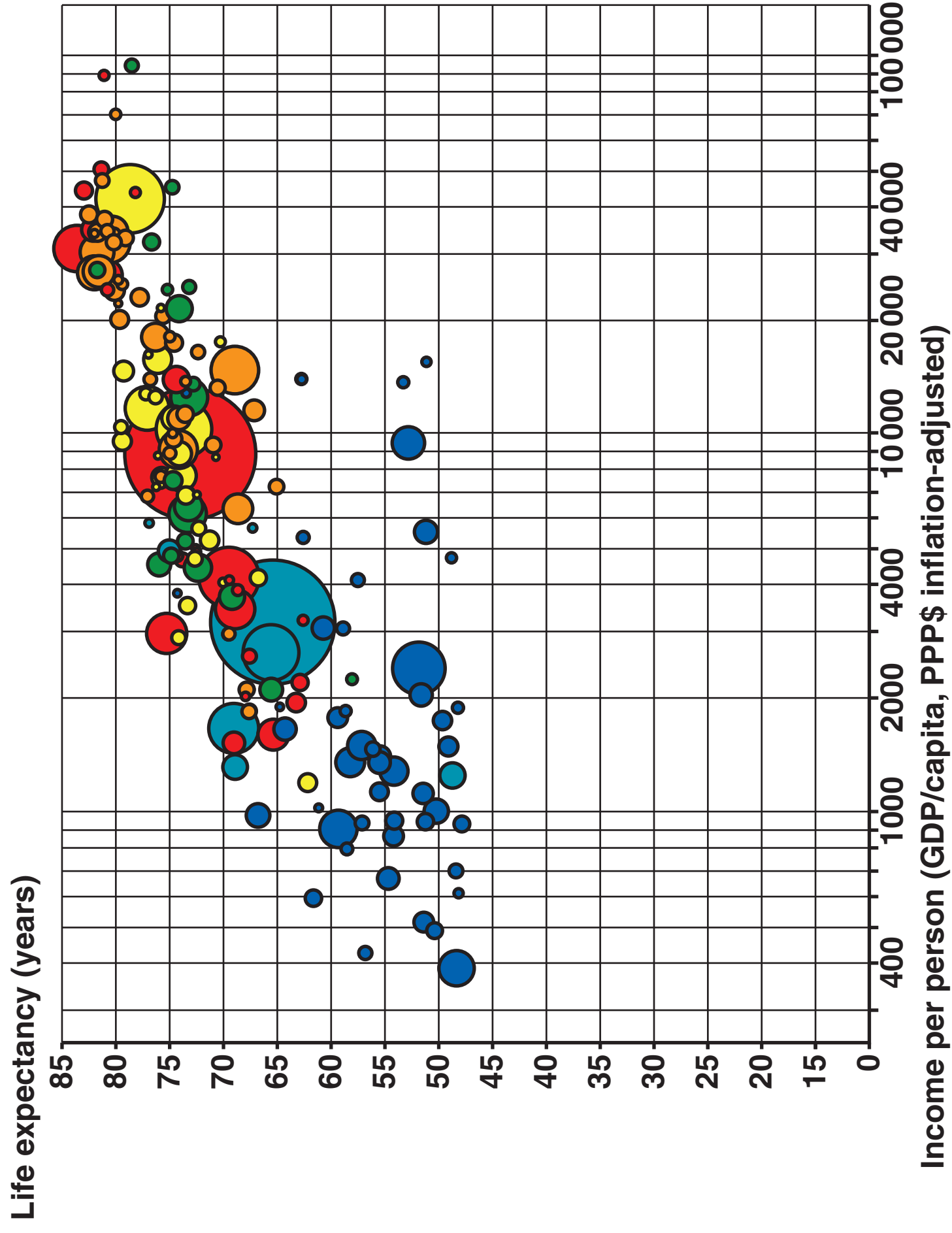
