Situation

Task

You begin the task as follows:

(When does the group meet?)
- **the aim of the group**
(Is there an age limit?)
- **details of the Christmas show**
(Are there parts for both boys and girls? Who wrote it?)
- **further information**
(What different tasks are there? How can people find out more?)

During the conversation you will also discuss:

- **whether it's an expensive hobby**
- **how much time it takes up**
(Does it interfere with school work?)

SANDRINGHAM



Built in 1870, Sandringham was once described as “the most comfortable house in the whole of England”. It has been passed down through four generations of the British monarchy and is now the Queen’s Norfolk country house.

The main ground floor rooms are still regularly used by the Royal Family. They are open to the public, when the Family is not in residence. Sandringham is a friendly and informal place to visit, with knowledgeable guides in every room.

After your tour, why not wander round the superb gardens and see the wonderful trees and plants, delightful in every season?

Visitor Centre:

- 200-seat self service restaurant with a wide range of snacks and meals
- Farm Shop selling local and organic produce

The House is open every day from Easter Saturday to 31st October between 11.00 and 16.45


