- Explain the term *independent judiciary* used in the extract. (a) (8 marks)
- (b) Using the extract and your own knowledge, critically assess the appointment processes of senior judges in the UK and US. (12 marks)
- Explain the 'centrality of the judges' in the US system of government compared with (c) their position in the UK. (20 marks)

Answer either Question 2 or Question 3 or Question 4.

- 2 Consider the extent to which political power is still centralised and concentrated in the UK system of government and still decentralised and dispersed in the US. (40 marks)
- 3 'A major function of any legislature is scrutiny and control of the executive.'
 Compare the extent to which this function is carried out effectively by the US Congress and the UK Parliament. (40 marks)
- 4 'Both the terms "prime-ministerial government" in the UK and "presidential government" in the US are over-simplistic descriptions of the realities of executive power in both countries.' Discuss. (40 marks)
