 To what extent is this still a valid description of US political parties? (20 marks)

- 3 Assess the factors that make some US pressure groups more successful than others in achieving their goals. (40 marks)
- 4 To what extent is voting behaviour in the US still determined by socio-economic factors rather than by candidates and issues? (40 marks)
