Topic 3	The Executive Branch of Government	
0 5	Explain the significance of 'iron triangles' in US government.	(10 marks)
0 6	'More imperilled than imperial.' Discuss this view of the US presidency.	(30 marks)
Topic 4	The Judicial Branch of Government: The Supreme Court	
0 7	Explain the principle of entrenched rights.	(10 marks)
0 8	'Nine politicians in robes.' Discuss, with reference to the US Supreme Court.	(30 marks)
