1. Liberalism

- (a) Explain why some liberals distrust the idea of democracy. [10]
- (b) Assess whether liberal thinking has had more impact on the Liberal Democratic Party than on any of the other political parties in the UK. [30]

2. Socialism

- (a) Explain why socialists reject the idea of private property ownership. [10]
- (b) 'The main argument amongst socialists has been about means, and not ends.' Discuss. [30]

3. Conservatism

- (a) Explain the importance of traditional institutions and values to conservatism. [10]
- (b) Evaluate the view that conservatism is more about the retention of power than about ideology. [30]

4. Nationalism

- (a) Explain why post-colonial nationalism is anti-western. [10]
- (b) 'Nationalism is a destructive ideology.' Discuss. [30]
