Choose **TWO** of the questions that follow, and answer both parts, (a) and (b), for both the questions that you choose.

### 1. The Electoral Process and Direct Democracy

- (a) Explain why the Electoral College can be defended. [10]
- (b) 'Candidates are more significant to the outcome of elections in the USA than other factors.' Discuss. [30]

#### 2. Political Parties

- (a) Explain why factions exist within the two main parties in the USA. [10]
- (b) Evaluate the claim that political parties are in serious decline in the USA. [30]

#### 3. Voting Behaviour

- (a) Explain why levels of turnout in US elections tend to be relatively low. [10]
- (b) Assess the extent to which religion and region play a more important role than other factors in determining voting behaviour in the USA. [30]

#### 4. Pressure Groups

- (a) Explain the importance of lobbying to pressure groups in the USA. [10]
- (b) Analyse whether pressure group politics in the USA is based more on pluralism than elitism. [30]
