1. The Constitutional Framework of US Government

(a) Explain how the US Constitution is flexible. [10]

(b) Assess the extent to which federalism is the most important principle underpinning the US Constitution. [30]

2. The Legislative Branch of Government: the US Congress

- (a) Explain the impact of gridlock on the work of Congress. [10]
- (b) Evaluate whether Congress is more effective at law-making than any of its other functions. [30]

3. The Executive Branch of Government

- (a) Explain the significance of the presidential veto. [10]
- (b) 'The federal bureaucracy is too powerful.' Discuss. [30]

4. The Judicial Branch of Government: the Supreme Court

- (a) Explain the Supreme Court's role as guardian of the Constitution. [10]
- (b) 'The Supreme Court's most effective role is as the champion of the rights of citizens.' Discuss. [30]
