Choose **TWO** of the questions that follow, and answer both parts, (a) and (b), for both the questions that you choose.

1. Liberalism

- (a) Explain the impact of liberal thinking on the Conservative party in the UK. [10]
- (b) Critically assess whether the principle of tolerance strengthens or undermines liberalism. [30]

2. Socialism

- (a) Explain the debates within socialism surrounding the concept of collectivism. [10]
- (b) 'Communism is more socialist than democratic socialism.' Discuss. [30]

3. Conservatism

- (a) Explain why conservatism has never been universally popular in Wales. [10]
- (b) 'Conservatism is not a coherent ideology, it is just a position of resistance to change.' Discuss. [30]

4. Nationalism

- (a) Explain the significance of the concept of organic communities for nationalism. [10]
- (b) Assess whether, in the modern world, nationalism has been replaced by supranationalism. [30]
