#### 2. Environmentalism

- (a) Explain the division of 'light' and 'dark' green thinking within the environmental movement.

- (b) Evaluate the view that environmentalism is not radical enough. [30]

#### 3. Feminism

- (a) Explain why the concepts of sex and gender are important in feminism. [10]
- (b) 'The glass ceiling has been smashed.' Assess the validity of this view in the context of feminism and politics. [30]

#### 4. Multiculturalism

- (a) Explain the impact of multiculturalism on Welsh culture. [10]
- (b) Evaluate whether positive discrimination/affirmative action has achieved more than any other aspect of multiculturalism. [30]
