0 7 A mother notices her child snatching a toy from another child. The mother says, "You're a naughty girl!"

Explain why it would have been better to say to the child, "It's naughty to snatch things from people." In your answer refer to self-concept **and/or** self-esteem. (4 marks)

0 8 A toddler shows attachment to both his parents and to a grandparent. Explain what is meant by attachment in this context. Refer to behaviours typical of the attached child in your answer. (6 marks)

0 9 Young children experience separation from an informal carer when they first attend nursery school. Explain **one** practical way in which the child's informal carer and a professional carer can support the child so as to avoid any harmful consequences of this separation. (3 marks)
