Question 3

Explain, with reference to the appropriate components of the eye, the changes causing Robert's sight to deteriorate. Include in your answer the name given to this problem and the effects on Robert's sight.

A dental survey of 100 adult females and 100 adult males produced the data shown in this table.

Dental Problems	Number of Females	Number of Males	
Gingivitis	15	29	
Gum Abscesses	5	7	
One or more fillings needed	22	24	
One or more extractions needed	13	25	

- The data in the table above show that the females have fewer dental problems than the males. Suggest **two** possible reasons which may explain why females have fewer dental problems than males. (2 marks)
- 1 4 What other conclusions can be drawn from the data in the table above? (5 marks)
- 1 5 Explain how gum abscesses form. (4 marks)
- 1 6 Stress can cause headaches. Name **one** other common cause of headaches. (1 mark)
- 1 7 Outline how headaches cause pain. (3 marks)
