**Source B** From advice given in 1835 by the Reverend Vaughan Thomas to the citizens of Oxford as to how they might avoid cholera.

'Be clean in your own persons and premises. Do not let any sort of filth gather in drains and gutters, especially where they run through narrow courts and in the midst of a thickly-peopled neighbourhood. If the pump be handy, clean out your gutters, morning and evening, by pumping; if the

5 pump be not handy, throw down buckets of water. Nothing is more likely to spread disease than the foul smells coming off from stagnations of filth.'
