1. Wales and England, c.1815-1832.

- (a) Explain why there was much popular protest in the period 1815-1822. [24]
- (b) To what extent did the Liberal Tory reforms satisfy the demands for reform in the period 1815-1832? [36]

2. British foreign policy, c.1815-1865.

- (a) Explain why Britain was satisfied with the outcome of the Congress of Vienna. [24]
- (b) To what extent was the Eastern Question the most important issue affecting British foreign policy in the period 1815-1865? [36]

3. Society in transition, 1815-1846.

- (a) Explain why the Corn Laws were repealed. [24]
- (b) To what extent were improvements in working conditions the most important changes in society in England and Wales, 1815-1846? [36]
