- (b) To what extent was the Chartist Movement the most significant development in economic and social change and popular protest, 1815-1848? [36]

3. Foreign policy, c.1793-1841

- (a) Explain why Britain was successful in the wars against France 1793-1815. [24]
- (b) To what extent were Castlereagh's policies the most significant development in British foreign policy in the period 1793-1841? [36]
