SECTION A

Answer one question.

1. England's relations with Ireland, Scotland and Wales, c. 1603-1649

To what extent were the religious policies of Charles I mainly responsible for damaging England's relationship with Ireland and Scotland? [40]

2. James II, the Glorious Revolution and party politics, c. 1685-1715

'The failure of the Revolutionary Settlement was mainly responsible for the development of party politics after 1689.' Discuss. [40]

SECTION B

Answer one question.

1. Crime, disorder and protest, c. 1603-1715

To what extent was poverty mainly responsible for the growth in crime, protest and disorder in the period 1603-1715? [40]

2. England's changing relations with foreign powers, c. 1603-1715

To what extent were relations with Spain the most important influence on England's foreign policy in the period 1603-1715? [40]
