Answer two questions, one from Section A and one from Section B.

SECTION A

Answer one question.

1. Crown, Council and Parliament in the reign of Elizabeth, 1558-1603

To what extent was the power and authority of the Crown greater in 1603 than it had been in 1558?

2. Mary Stuart and England's relations with the Catholic Powers, 1568-1588

'The Pope's reaction to Elizabeth's religious policies did more to harm relations between England and the Catholic powers than any other factor.' Discuss. [40]

SECTION B

Answer one question.

1. Poverty, vagrancy and the poor in Wales and England, 1483-1603

'The most significant cause of poverty and vagrancy in this period was economic depression.' Discuss.

2. Tudor foreign policy, 1483-1603

To what extent were relations with the Netherlands the most important influence on Tudor foreign policy in the period between 1483 and 1603? [40]
