- To what extent was the Elizabethan Church Settlement the most important of the religious (b)changes in the period 1529-1570? [36]

- Explain why the monarchy felt threatened by the Pilgrimage of Grace. (a)[24]
- (b)To what extent was poverty **mainly responsible** for causing the rebellions in the period 1529-1569? [36]
