- (b) To what extent was the growth of trade unionism the MOST SIGNIFICANT influence on popular protest in the period 1815-1848? [36]

- (a) EXPLAIN WHY the Public Health Act of 1848 was passed. [24]
- (b) How far was government action MAINLY RESPONSIBLE for bringing about social reform in the period 1815-1848? [36]

- 4 British foreign policy, c. 1793-1841
- (a) EXPLAIN WHY war broke out between Britain and France in 1793. [24]
- (b) To what extent was the Congress System the MOST IMPORTANT influence upon British foreign policy in the period 1793-1841? [36]
