Answer two questions, one from Section A and one from Section B.

SECTION A

Answer one question.

1. England's relations with Ireland, Scotland and Wales, c. 1603-1649

'The monarchy had a better relationship with the English parliament than it had with the parliaments of Ireland and Scotland.' Discuss. [40]

2. James II, the Glorious Revolution and party politics, c. 1685-1715

'The deposition of James II strengthened rather than weakened the power and authority of the Crown.' Discuss. [40]

SECTION B

Answer one question.

1. Crime, disorder and protest, c. 1603-1715

To what extent were radical ideas mainly responsible for the growth in protest and disorder in the period between 1603 and 1715? [40]

2. England's changing relations with foreign powers, c. 1603-1715

'The most significant development affecting England's relations with foreign powers during the period 1603-1715 was her relationship with the Dutch.' Discuss. [40]
