Answer two questions.

1. Politics and government in Wales and England, c. 1780-1832

- (a) Explain why the Younger Pitt introduced a policy of repression in the 1790s. [24]
- (b) To what extent were the Liberal Tory reforms the most significant development in politics and government in the period 1780-1832? [36]

2. Economic and social change and popular protest, c. 1815-1848

- (a) Explain why Factory Acts were passed in this period. [24]
- (b) To what extent was the Anti-Corn Law League the most important influence on economic and social change and popular protest in the period 1815-1848? [36]

3. Foreign policy, c. 1793-1841

- (a) Explain why the Royal Navy was successful in the wars against France 1793-1815. [24]
- (b) To what extent was British foreign policy mainly influenced by the need to protect overseas trade in the period 1793-1841? [36]
