  - (b) To what extent were the Liberal Reforms **the most important change** in Wales and England 1880-1929? [36]
- 2. British foreign policy, c. 1902-1939
  - (a) **Explain why** Britain formed an alliance with Japan in 1902. [24]
  - (b) To what extent was the fear of Germany **the most important influence** on British foreign policy between 1902-1939? [36]
- 3. Party politics, c. 1900-1940
  - (a) **Explain why** the Coalition Government collapsed in 1922. [24]
  - (b) To what extent were the Conservatives **the most dominant party** in British politics from 1900-1940? [36]
- 4. The changing role and status of women, 1880-1929
  - (a) **Explain why** the role of women was important during the First World War. [24]
  - (b) To what extent was the Suffragist movement **the main influence** on the changing role and status of women 1880-1929? [36]
