# 1. Europe, c. 1815-1851

- (a) **Explain why** Europe remained at peace between 1815-1822. [24]
- (b) To what extent was fear of revolution the **most significant influence** on European relations in the period 1815-1851? [36]

# 2. Italy, c. 1830-1871

- (a) Explain why Garibaldi was able to liberate Southern Italy in 1860. [24]
- (b) To what extent did Mazzini make the **most significant contribution** to Italian unification in the period 1830-1871? [36]

# 3. Germany, c. 1830-1871

- (a) **Explain why** Prussia had become the dominant state in Germany by 1866. [24]
- (b) To what extent was the contribution of German nationalists the **most important influence** on the process of German unification between 1830-1871? [36]

#### 4. The Eastern Question, 1815-1856

- (a) **Explain why** Mehemet Ali caused tension between the Great Powers from 1831-1841. [24]
- (b) To what extent was the weakness of the Ottoman Empire **mainly responsible** for the Eastern Question 1815-1856? [36]
