1. Russia during the reign of Peter the Great, 1696-1725

- (a) **Explain why** Russia became involved in conflict in the Baltic during the reign of Peter the Great. [24]
- (b) To what extent was the policy of westernisation the **most important change** during Peter the Great's reign, 1696-1725? [36]

2. Prussia during the reign of Frederick the Great, 1740-1786

- (a) **Explain why** Silesia was important for Prussia up to 1748. [24]
- (b) To what extent were Frederick the Great's military successes the **most important** achievement of his reign, 1740-1786? [36]

3. The Hapsburg Empire during the reigns of Charles VI and Maria Theresa, 1711-1780

- (a) **Explain why** Charles VI was successful during his reign. [24]
- (b) To what extent was the Diplomatic Revolution the **most important development** in the Hapsburg Empire during the period 1711-1780? [36]

4. International relations, c. 1710-1756

(a) **Explain why** the Treaty of Utrecht affected relations between the European powers.

[24]

(b) To what extent was the rivalry between Austria and Prussia the **most significant** development in international relations between 1710 and 1756? [36]
