- 1. Russia during the reign of Peter the Great, 1696-1725
  - (a) **Explain why** St. Petersburg was built by Peter the Great.

- (b) To what extent were Peter the Great's military reforms the **most important development** of his reign? [36]
- 2. Prussia during the reign of Frederick the Great, 1740-1786
  - (a) **Explain why** Prussia was at war between 1756 and 1763.

- (b) To what extent was the expansion of the economy the **most significant development** of Frederick the Great's reign? [36]
- 3. The Hapsburg Empire during the reigns of Charles VI and Maria Theresa, 1711-1780
  - (a) **Explain why** Austria became involved in war in 1740.

- (b) To what extent were the domestic and social policies of Charles VI the **most significant development** in the Hapsburg Empire during the period 1711-1780? [36]
- 4. International relations, c. 1710-1756
  - (a) **Explain why** there was war in the Baltic between 1710 and 1721.
