Modern computer games consoles allow users to take part in simulated activities such as tennis and motor racing and also to undertake keep fit exercises. The manufacturers of these consoles provide a variety of different interfaces that allow users to fully interact with the console when playing these games. The interfaces allow pressure detection, sound detection, movements such as shaking, twisting and pointing and the monitoring of a user's pulse. The consoles also have an in-built camera that can photograph the user.
