1. Use the Trapezium Rule with five ordinates to find an approximate value for the integral

$$
\int_{0}^{2} \frac{1}{2+x^{3}} \mathrm{~d} x
$$

Show your working and give your answer correct to three decimal places.
2. (a) (i) Show that the equation

$$
6 \cos \theta+5 \tan \theta=0
$$

may be rewritten in the form

$$
6 \sin ^{2} \theta-5 \sin \theta-6=0
$$

(ii) Find all values of $\theta$ in the range $0^{\circ} \leqslant \theta \leqslant 360^{\circ}$ satisfying the equation

$$
6 \cos \theta+5 \tan \theta=0
$$

(b) Find all values of $x$ in the range $0^{\circ} \leqslant x \leqslant 180^{\circ}$ satisfying

$$
\begin{equation*}
\cos \left(2 x-60^{\circ}\right)=0.788 . \tag{3}
\end{equation*}
$$

3. The diagram below shows a sketch of the triangle $A B C$ with $A B=x \mathrm{~cm}, A C=(x-2) \mathrm{cm}$ and $B C=(x+2) \mathrm{cm}$.

(a) Show that $\cos B \hat{A C}=\frac{x-8}{2 x-4}$.
(b) Given that $B \widehat{A C}=120^{\circ}$,
(i) find the value of $x$,
(ii) find the size of $A \widehat{B C}$.
4. (a) An arithmetic series has first term $a$ and common difference $d$. Prove that the sum of the first $n$ terms of the series is given by

$$
\begin{equation*}
S_{n}=\frac{n}{2}[2 a+(n-1) d] . \tag{3}
\end{equation*}
$$

(b) The sum of the first ten terms of an arithmetic series is 115 . The sum of the next four terms of this series is 130 . Find the first term and the common difference of the arithmetic series.
5. (a) Find the sum of the first eighteen terms of the geometric series

$$
100+80+64+\ldots .
$$

Give your answer correct to the nearest whole number.
(b) The second term of a geometric series is -20 . The sum to infinity of the series is 64 .
(i) Show that $r$, the common ratio of the series, satisfies the equation

$$
16 r^{2}-16 r-5=0 .
$$

(ii) Find the value of $r$, giving a reason for your answer.
6. (a) Find $\int\left(\sqrt[4]{x}+\frac{2}{x^{5}}\right) \mathrm{d} x$.
(b)


The diagram shows a sketch of the curve $y=x^{2}+3$ and the line $y=4 x$. The curve and the line intersect at the points $A$ and $B$.
The line $B C$ is parallel to the $y$-axis.
(i) Showing your working, find the $x$-coordinates of $A$ and $B$.
(ii) Find the area of the shaded region.
7. (a) Given that $x>0, y>0$, show that

$$
\begin{equation*}
\log _{a} x y=\log _{a} x+\log _{a} y . \tag{3}
\end{equation*}
$$

(b) Solve the equation

$$
5^{2-3 x}=8
$$

Show your working and give your answer correct to three decimal places.
(c) Solve the equation

$$
\begin{equation*}
\log _{a} 90 x^{2}-\log _{a}\left(\frac{5}{x}\right)=\frac{1}{2} \log _{a} 144 x^{8} \tag{4}
\end{equation*}
$$

8. The circle $C_{1}$ has centre $A$ and equation

$$
x^{2}+y^{2}+2 x-6 y-15=0 .
$$

(a) Find the coordinates of $A$ and the radius of $C_{1}$.
(b) The line $L$ has equation $y=-x+9$.
(i) Show that $L$ is not a diameter of $C_{1}$.
(ii) Find the coordinates of the points of intersection of $L$ and $C_{1}$.
(c) The circle $C_{2}$ has centre $B(11,8)$ and radius 6 . Find the shortest distance between the circles $C_{1}$ and $C_{2}$.

The diagram shows three points $A, B$ and $C$ on a circle with centre $O$ and radius 7.2 cm .
(a) Given that $A \widehat{O} B=1 \cdot 1$ radians, find the area of triangle $A O B$. Give your answer correct to one decimal place.
(b) The area of sector $B O C$ is $19.44 \mathrm{~cm}^{2}$. Find the length of the $\operatorname{arc} B C$.
