OR (b) "Alternative representations of social groups or places are not possible."

How far do you believe this to be true?

SECTION C

EITHER (a) Genre texts have sometimes been criticised for being predictable and unimaginative.

Discuss.

OR (b) Recent developments in genre have included the emergence of parody, pastiche and hybrid forms.

Show how such developments have influenced the nature of media texts.

SECTION D

MEDIA AUDIENCES

EITHER (a) "We are all voyeurs now, or so it would appear if contemporary television output is anything to go by."

Discuss this view of television audiences.

OR (b) To what extent are audiences able to resist viewpoints constructed by the media?
