INSTRUCTIONS FOR INVIGILATORS

To be given immediately to the teacher responsible for GCE Media Studies

These instructions must be used in conjunction with the regulations and General Instructions for the January 2007 GCE Examination. The contents of the DVD are confidential and must not be shared with candidates before the examination.

BEFORE THE EXAMINATION

- One copy of the DVD per 20 candidates plus one spare copy have been sent to centres. If you 1 require further copies they may be obtained from the AQA.
- A transcript of the commentary is provided on page two of these instructions.
- The viewing and intervals have been recorded on the DVD so that they follow the instructions to 3 the candidates on the written paper. The DVD should be started at the beginning of the examination and played through to the end without interruption. Candidates should then begin writing their response. The invigilator is not required to time intervals.
- The confidential DVDs supplied by the AQA may only be checked in the period 3 working days prior to the commencement of the examination. In case of problems with a DVD further copies are available from the AQA. Centres are reminded that this is an unseen examination. All information about the content of this DVD must remain confidential.
- Question papers and answer books, on which the candidates may make notes during the preparation period, are to be distributed before the DVD is started.
- Candidates must be warned before the test that they may not ask for any of the DVD to be replayed nor talk with other candidates. Once the DVD has been started no attempt should be made to play for a second time any part which may have been obscured because of noise from outside. If any serious interference of this kind occurs during the playing of the DVD, the AQA should be informed by letter. If there is a serious emergency in the room (e.g. the sudden illness of a candidate), the DVD should be stopped and later, when the emergency has been dealt with, re-started at exactly the same place. The AQA should be informed by letter of the occurrence and of the point on the DVD at which the interruption took place.
- Candidates should be instructed to read the question paper before the DVD is started.

THE EXAMINATION

- 8 Start the DVD.
- 9 After the introduction, the invigilator must stop the DVD to ensure that all the candidates are able to see and hear clearly. The exact positioning of this pause is indicated on the screen.
- 10 The DVD should be restarted as quickly as possible and allowed to run to the end without pause. The timing of the examination begins when the DVD is started.
- 11 At the end of the viewing, candidates will have **one hour** to write their response.
- 12 At the end of the examination the scripts should be collected and despatched to the examiner in the normal way.
