Answer the question below, with detailed reference to specific examples from the extract only.

- 1 Discuss the ways in which the following are used, in this extract from *The Italian Job* (Dir. F Gary Gray):
 - Camera Angle, Shot, Movement and Position
 - Editing
 - Sound
 - Special Effects
 - Mise-en-scène.

Section B: Comparative Textual Study

- Answer **one** question on the topic for which you have been prepared.
- You should make **detailed reference to specific examples** from the **two** texts you have studied for comparison.
- Identify the titles/dates/episodes/editions (as appropriate) of your chosen two texts at the start of your answer.

Compare the representation of materialism in the **two** magazines you have studied.

(d) Gender and Television Situation Comedy

Compare how the representation of gender is explored in the narratives of the **two** television programmes you have studied. [45 marks]

(e) Conflict/Competition and Video/Computer Games

Compare how conflict/competition is represented by the heroes and villains in the **two** video/ computer games you have studied. [45 marks]

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
