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Viewing the Unseen Moving Image Extract

Extract: King Arthur (Dir. Antoine Fuqua 2004)

Extract length: 5 mins max.

Answer the question below, with detailed reference to specific examples from the extract only.

- 1 Discuss the ways in which the following are used, in this extract from *King Arthur* (Dir. Antoine Fuqua 2004):
 - Camera Angle, Shot, Movement and Position
 - Editing
 - Sound
 - Special Effects
 - Mise-en-scène.

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Section B: Comparative Textual Study

- Answer one question on the topic for which you have been prepared.
- You should make detailed reference to specific examples from the two texts you have studied for comparison.
- Identify the titles/dates/episodes/editions (as appropriate) of your chosen two texts at the start of your answer.

2 (a) Consumerism and Lifestyle Magazines

Compare how the aspirations of the target readership are represented in images and words in your chosen **two** magazines. [45 marks]

(b) Celebrity and the Tabloid Press

Compare the ways in which the visual and written elements of your **two** chosen tabloid newspapers represent celebrity. [45 marks]

(c) Music Culture and Radio

Compare how music culture is represented in your chosen **two** radio programmes.

[45 marks]

(d) Gender and Television Situation Comedy

Compare how the representation of gender is constructed by the characters' appearance and dialogue in your chosen **two** television programmes. [45 marks]

(e) Conflict/Competition and Video/Computer Games

Compare how conflict/competition is represented in your chosen **two** video/computer games. [45 marks]
