Almost one fifth of youngsters cyber-bullied



Nearly one in five UK youngsters have been the victim of cyber-bullying, with girls affected more than boys. Many victims said the experience had damaged their confidence, mental health and even affected their school attendance.

Those who said they would not seek help, gave fear of making it worse and being able to deal with it themselves, as some of the reasons. Many thought that cyber-bullies do not actually think they are bullying. They believe that it is merely a form of 'harmless fun', a joke and therefore not an issue.
