1 Read the passage and answer questions (a) and (b) which follow.

"In his Passion narrative, Mark not only described what actually happened at the crucifixion, but also wanted to give his readership a clear understanding of the significance of the events. For Mark, there was a strong link between who Jesus was and what Jesus did."

- (a) Explain what Mark's Passion narrative reveals about the person of Jesus. (10 marks)
- (b) Explain what the events in Mark's Passion narrative reveal about the significance of Jesus' death. (10 marks)
- 2 (a) Explain what John's Prologue (John 1¹⁻¹⁸) teaches about the person of Jesus. (15 marks)
 - (b) Explain how Luke's Birth narrative portrays Jesus as being truly human and of humble birth, and assess the view that this was the main purpose of Luke's Birth narrative. (25 marks)
- 3 (a) Explain what the parable of the Tenants in the Vineyard teaches. (15 marks)
 - (b) "The parables in the gospels are creations by the Early Church."

With reference to a different parable that you have studied, explain this view and assess how far you agree with it. (25 marks)
