- 2 (a) Examine the ways in which the teachings within **one** religion you have studied relate to the issue of consumerism. (20 marks)
 - (b) Outline MacIntyre's version of Virtue Ethics, and assess whether religion or MacIntyre's Virtue Ethics is more applicable to the issue of consumerism. (30 marks)
- **3** (a) Examine the ways in which the teachings within **one** religion you have studied apply to the issue of animal experimentation. (20 marks)
 - (b) Explain how Aristotle's account of a life lived in accordance with the Virtues could be applied to the issue of animal experimentation, and assess the view that this approach is more helpful than a religious approach in addressing the issue. *(30 marks)*
