(a) Outline the ways in which the passages you have studied present the idea of God as one. *(10 marks)*

(b) Outline the ways in which the passages you have studied present the idea of God as lawgiver. *(10 marks)*

2 (a) Examine the characteristics of prophecy in the 10th and 9th centuries BCE. *(15 marks)*

(b) Outline the reasons why Elijah came into conflict with King Ahab, and assess how far it was inevitable that prophets came into conflict with the leaders of their day. *(25 marks)*

3 (a) Identify the criticisms which Amos made of the social and religious lives of the people of his time, and explain the reasons for these criticisms. *(15 marks)*

(b) Outline the theme of punishment in the book of Amos, and assess the claim that the message of the book of Amos is essentially one of doom. *(25 marks)*
