Question 3 The design argument		
0 5	Examine the ways in which the design argument has been criticised by David	Hume. (30 marks)
AND		
0 6	'Hume's criticisms do not destroy the design argument.'	
	Assess this view.	(15 marks)
Question 4 Quantum mechanics and a religious world view		
0 7	Explain the key ideas in the world view of quantum mechanics.	(30 marks)
AND		
0 8	'Quantum mechanics brings agreement between science and religion closer.'	
	Assess this statement.	(15 marks)
