#### Answer two questions.

- (a) 'Utilitarian thinking is consequential.' 1 Explain the meaning of this statement. Refer to the utilitarianism of both Bentham and (30 marks) Mill in your answer. 'Happiness is the only goal in life that is worth working for.' (b) Discuss how far you agree. (15 marks) Examine how Situation Ethics may be applied to **one** ethical issue of your choice. 2 (a) (Do **not** choose abortion or euthanasia.) (30 marks) (b) How far is Situation Ethics a satisfactory approach to moral decision-making? (15 marks) Explain religious teaching about equality with particular reference to gender and race. 3 (a) You may refer to more than one religion in your answer. (30 marks) 'People with disabilities are less valuable than able-bodied people.' (b) To what extent must religion reject this view? (15 marks)
- 4 (a) Summarise arguments against abortion with reference to both ethical and religious teachings. (30 marks)
  - (b) 'The mother's right to life should always overrule the rights of her unborn child.'

Assess this view. (15 marks)
