Examine definitions of, and ideas about, God/Ultimate Reality in the religion(s) you have studied. (45 marks)

Examine religious language as a meaningful way of talking about God/Ultimate Reality. (45 marks)

and



'The nature of God/Ultimate Reality means that any attempt to talk about God/Ultimate Reality will fail.'

Assess this view.

and



'Religious experiences may have inspired the foundation of religions but they have little to contribute to those religions today.'
