Question 2 Creation

0 3 Examine differing religious views of the creation of the world and of human beings. **[30 marks]**

and

0 4 'Science makes belief in God as creator irrelevant.'
Assess this claim. **[15 marks]**

Question 3 The design argument

0 5 Explain the design argument as presented by Aquinas. **[30 marks]**

and

0 6 To what extent does design in the universe make it reasonable to believe in God? **[15 marks]**

Question 4 Quantum mechanics and a religious world view

0 7 Explain key ideas in the world view of quantum mechanics.

[30 marks]

and

0 8 'Quantum mechanics has nothing at all in common with religion.'

Assess this view.

[15 marks]
