0 3 Examine ways in which divisions within religion(s) create challenges for those religion(s).

0 4 'Such internal divisions make it totally impossible for religions to survive.'

Assess this view.

Question 3 New forms of spirituality both within and outside religions

0 5 Explain reasons for the rise of interest in spirituality in recent years.

and

0 6 'The rise of interest in spirituality is greater outside mainstream religion than within it.'

Assess this claim.

Question 4 Religion and national identity

0 7 Explain what is meant by a secular state.

[30 marks]

and

0 8 'In the 21st century, the state must be secular.'

Assess this view.
