4 (b) Assess the view that it is the definition of the start of human life which lies at the heart of the rights and wrongs of abortion.

There are many different view of when life begins. The beginning of life may be from the moment of conception this is what the Roman Catholics teach, or from the embryo stage or the moment of birth, although not many people agree that this is right. If the person's life begins at the moment of conception then abortion is murder According to the Bible murder is wrong so this makes abortion wrong as well.

Other people believe that a person's life starts later. For example some argue that it does not start until the baby is capable of living on its own outside the mother's body. Those who believe this will then argue that abortion may be allowed before the baby reaches that point and that it is not murder because there is no person being killed.

Others say that God puts the soul into the baby at some point and that it is then that abortion is wrong. This also shows that the moment human life starts is what decides.

Commentary

The answer comes from a Christian perspective and the candidate is aware of different points of view about when human life starts. However, the candidate has lost sight of the question which was not about when human life began but about whether this issue was 'at the heart' of the debate.

As a result the argument is one sided. It explains the ideas quite clearly but offers nothing to support the point of view that this is not the central issue. It may be that there was not enough time for the answer to be finished.
