- 3 Compare either a Hindu or a Buddhist understanding of causation with the belief that the universe exists because of a creator God.

- 4 To what extent are the ethics of either Hinduism or Buddhism relativist?
- 5 'The main aim of ethics should be the cultivation of virtue.' Discuss with reference to either Hinduism or Buddhism.
- To what extent does either Hinduism or Buddhism provide a morally acceptable response to issues raised by environmental ethics?
