1 Explain what G-d required of Adam according to Genesis1:26-30. [33] (b) 'The agreement between G-d and Adam cannot really be described as a covenant.' Discuss. [17] 2 (a) Explain the main features of the covenants G-d made with Abraham. [33] (b) 'The covenants with Abraham had more significance for Abraham than for the Jewish people.' Discuss. [17] 3 (a) Explain the differences between the covenants G-d made with Moses and with David. [33] (b) 'The covenants with Moses and with David have nothing in common.' Discuss. [17] Part 2 Answer **one** question from this part. 4 (a) Explain what might be described as miraculous in the story of Jonah. [33] (b) 'The writer of the book of Jonah did not intend the story to be taken literally.' Discuss. [17] 5 Explain the main religious questions raised in Job 1-14 and 42. [33] **(b)** To what extent do the arguments of the 'comforters' make sense? [17] (a) Describe what happens to Job in the Prologue (chapter 1) and how the situation is resolved in 6 the last chapter. [33] **(b)** 'The last chapter of Job makes nonsense of the rest of the book.' Discuss. [17]
