[17] 3 (a) Explain how different theories of analogy express the nature of God. [33] (b) 'Despite the attempts of philosophers, religious language is still meaningless.' Discuss. [17]

4 (a) Explain what is meant by the concept of resurrection. [33]
(b) 'The concept of resurrection is incoherent.' Discuss. [17]
5 (a) Explain why some philosophers argue that belief in an afterlife solves the problem of evil. [33]
(b) 'The promise of an afterlife is an inadequate response to the problem of evil.' Discuss. [17]
6 (a) Give an account of how God reveals himself to the world through miracles. [33]
(b) 'All criticisms of miracles have proved to be invalid.' Discuss. [17]
